By car:

From Berlin:

A 19 to the Rostock interchange (Rostocker Kreuz), carry on along the A 20 in the direction of Lübeck / Wismar.
 Exit 13 (Ausfahrt 13) to Bad Doberan, then follow the signs to Heiligendamm.

From Hamburg:

A 1 to the Lübeck interchange (Kreuz Lübeck), carry on along the A 20 in the direction of Rostock.
 Exit 12 (Ausfahrt 12) in the direction of Kröpelin. In Kröpelin drive along the B 105 via Reddelich and Steffenshagen, then follow the signs to Heiligendamm.

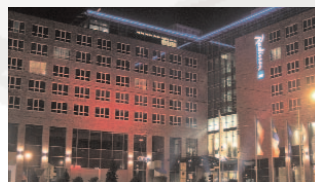
